Gateway Welcome Project Kicks Off Immigrant Welcome Week With a Big Assist from the St. Louis Construction Industry

More than \$200,000 Raised to Build Immigrant/Refugee Student Soccer Field

Builders Donate Services to Build Field, Shelter and More

Field Dedication Tuesday, September 13, 2016 at 1 p.m. Nahed Chapman New American Academy 1530 S. Grand Ave.

What:	The universal language of soccer is now infused in PE programs at Nahed Chapman New American Academy (NCNAA) , a St. Louis Public Schools K-10 facility with 370 students from 27 countries, speaking 18 languages. A new artificial surface soccer field will be dedicated at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 13, 2016. It was built through a fundraiser
	by the <u>Gateway Welcome Project</u> and donated services from the St. Louis construction industry, mobilized by <u>Construction Forum St. Louis</u> . More than \$200,000 was raised to create the field, a custom-designed shelter area and landscaping.
	The dedication will be the centerpiece of St. Louis' celebration of "Welcoming Week," a national event which celebrates the contributions of immigrants to America's history and to its future. The St. Louis celebration is being spearheaded by the <u>St. Louis Mosaic</u> <u>Project.</u>
When:	Tuesday, Sept. 13, 2016. Field dedication and tour opportunities at 1 p.m. Open house for NCNAA families and public 4:30 p.m6:30 p.m. (program at 6 p.m.)
Where:	Nahed Chapman New American Academy, 1530 S. Grand Ave. (east side of Grand, between I-44 and St. Louis University Hospital).
Interviews:	Students will be playing soccer on the field during both events. Representatives of St. Louis Public Schools officials; two dozen construction industry organizations, the St. Louis Mosaic Project, and the City of St. Louis will be on hand for interviews.
