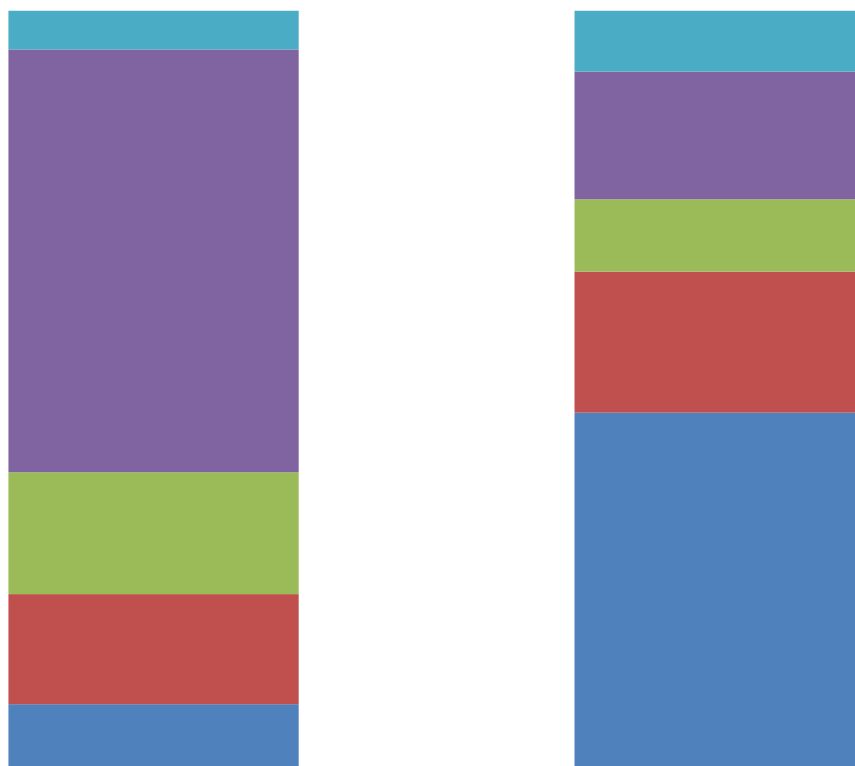

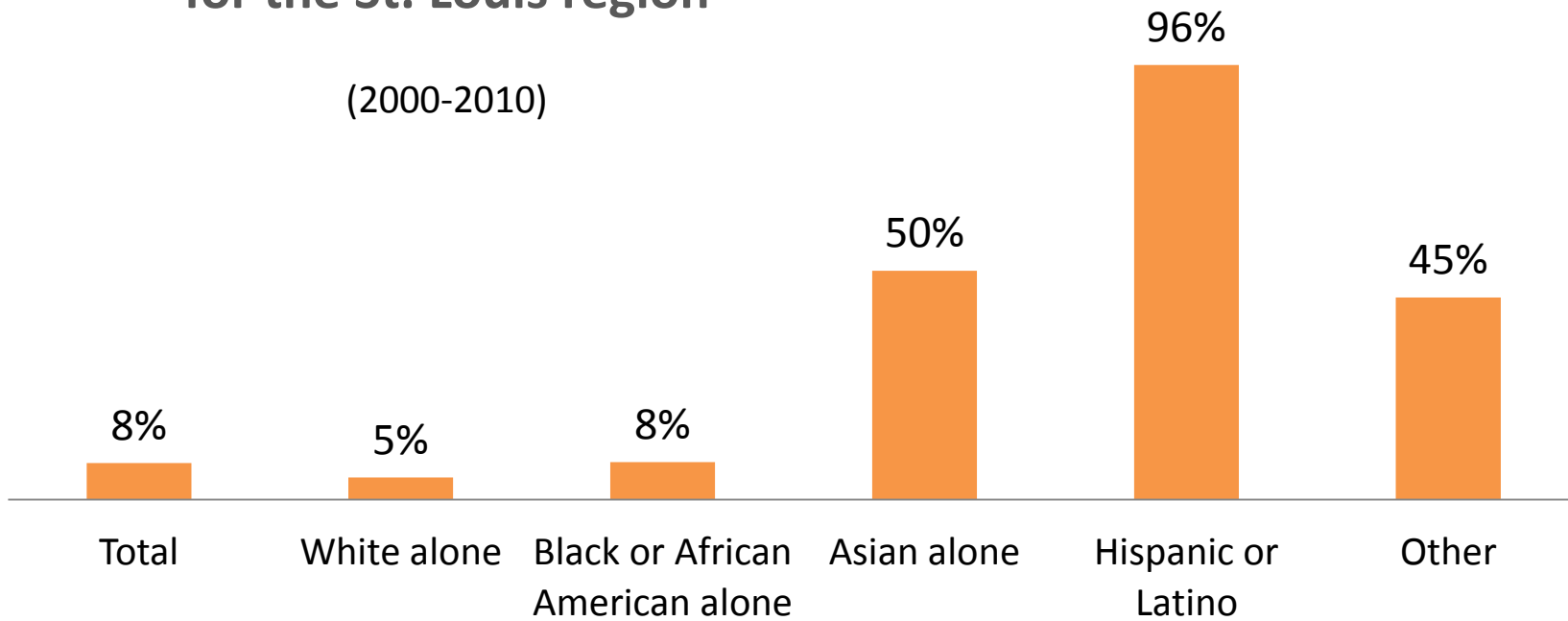


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LATINOS have experienced

(2000-2010)

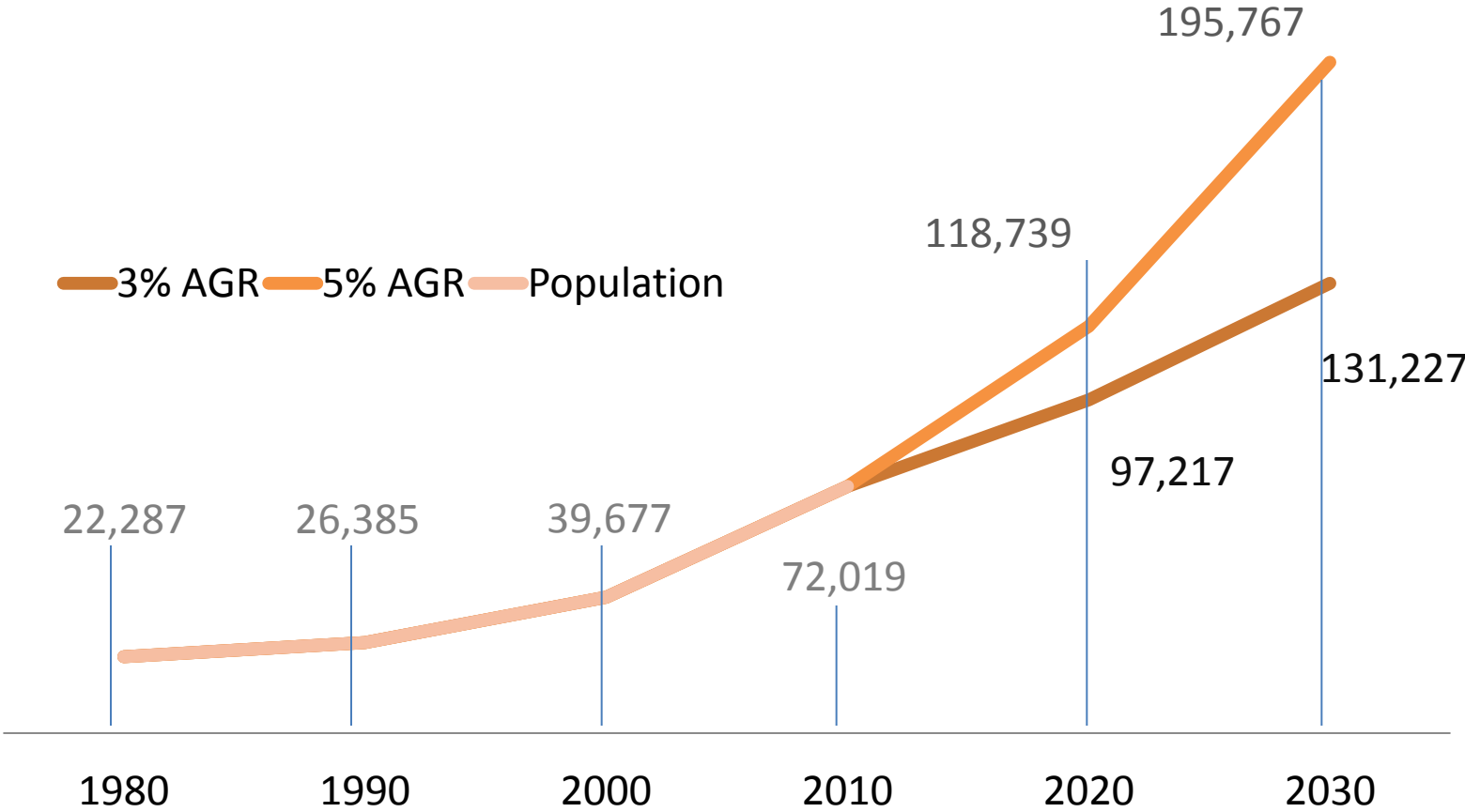

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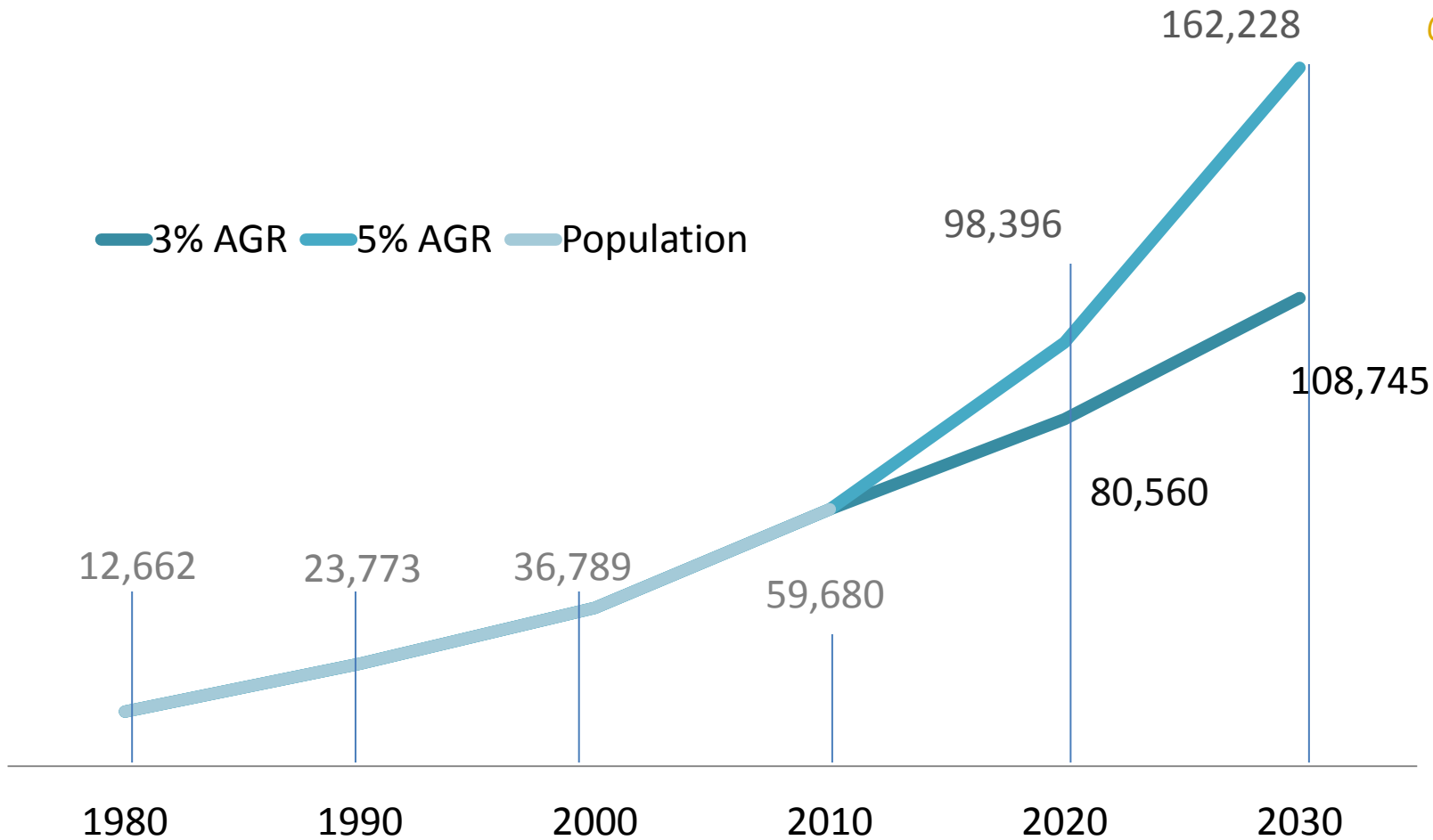


POPULATION TRENDS: asians in st. louis



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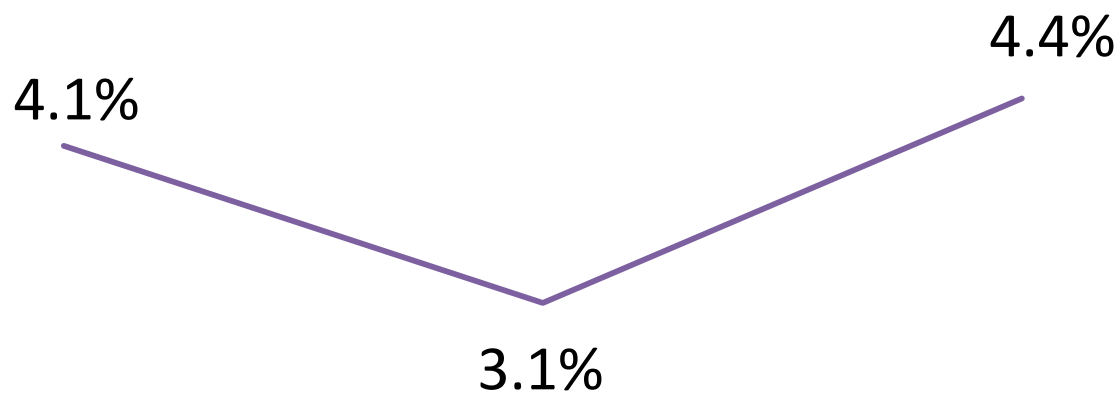

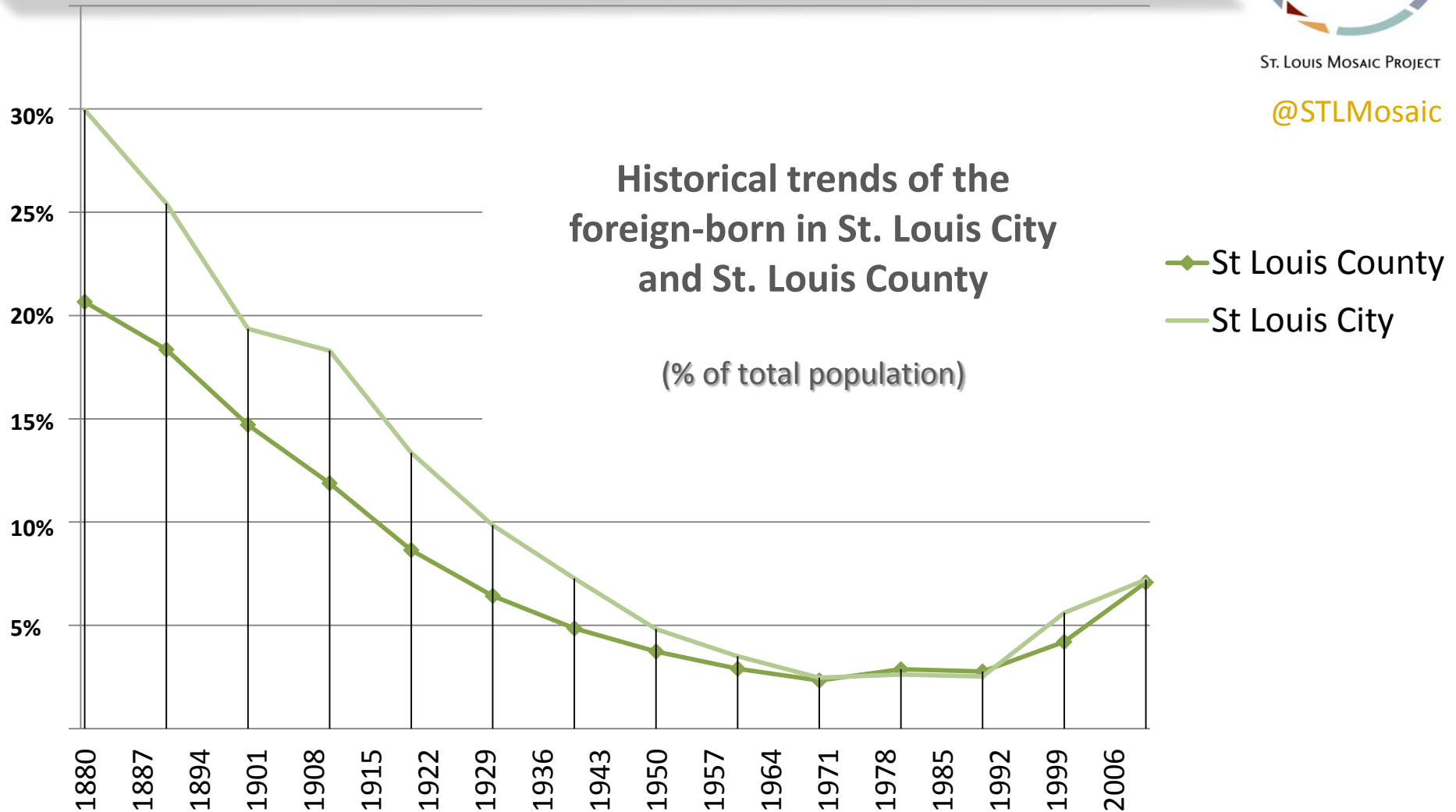


POPULATION TRENDS: city/county



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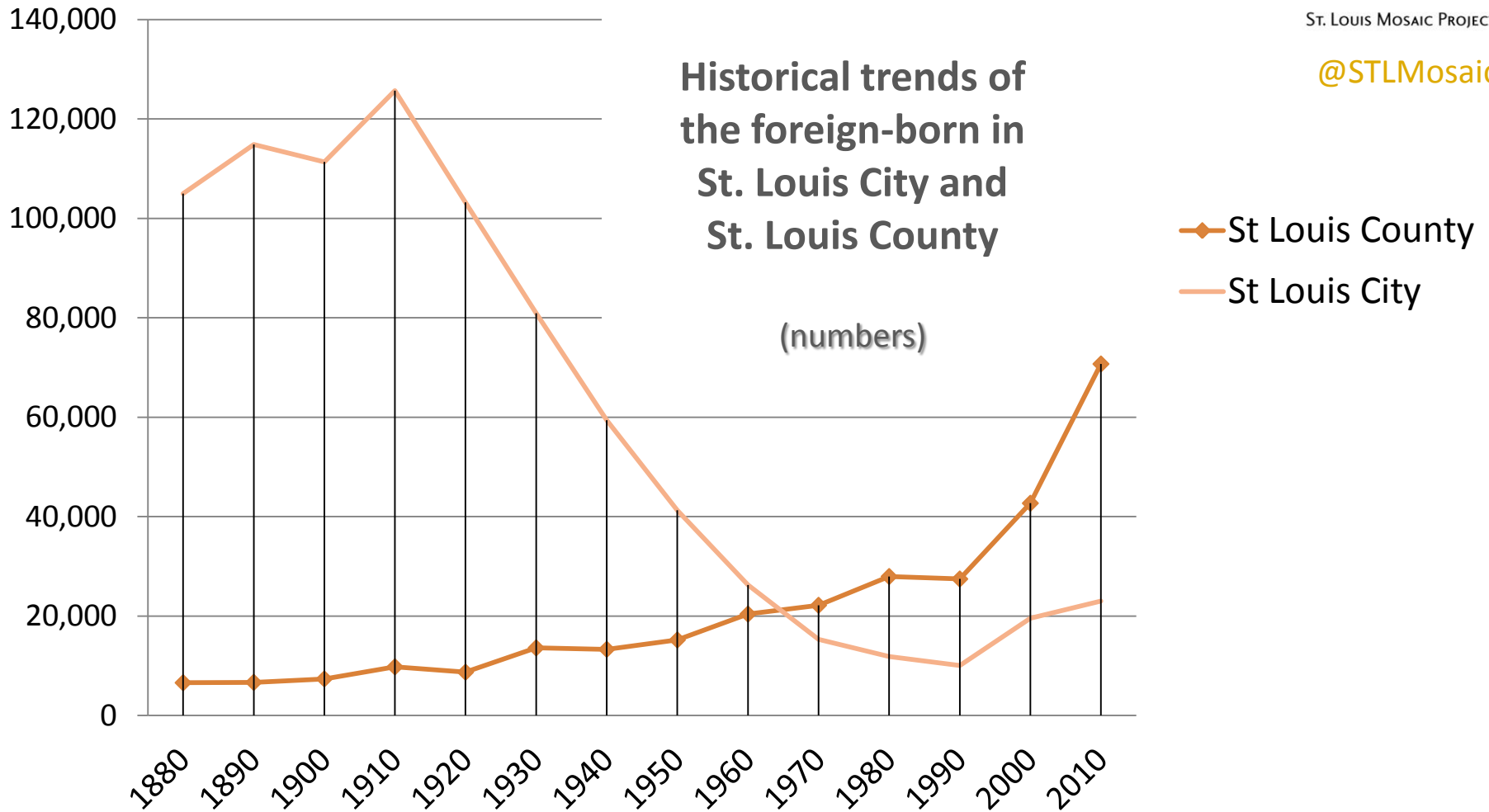

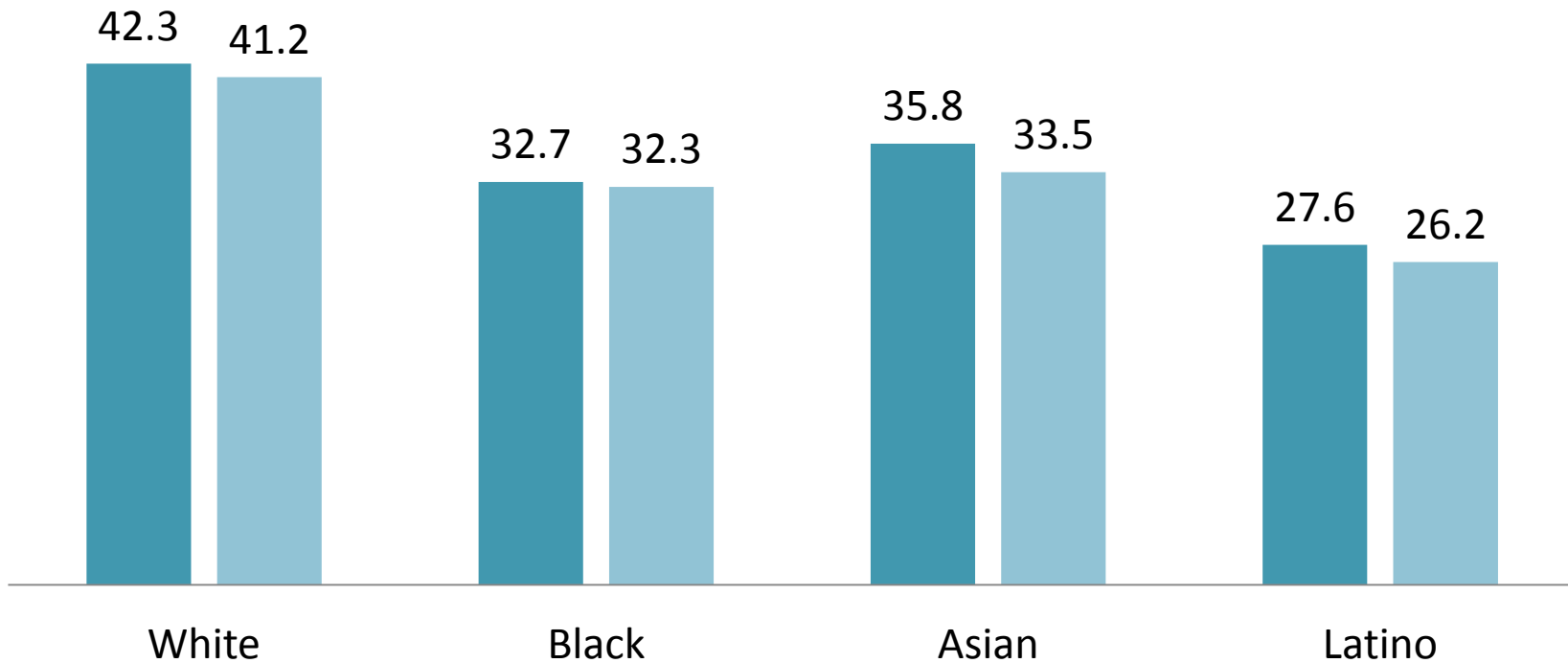


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LATINOS are the youngest population

POPULATION PYRAMID: black/white



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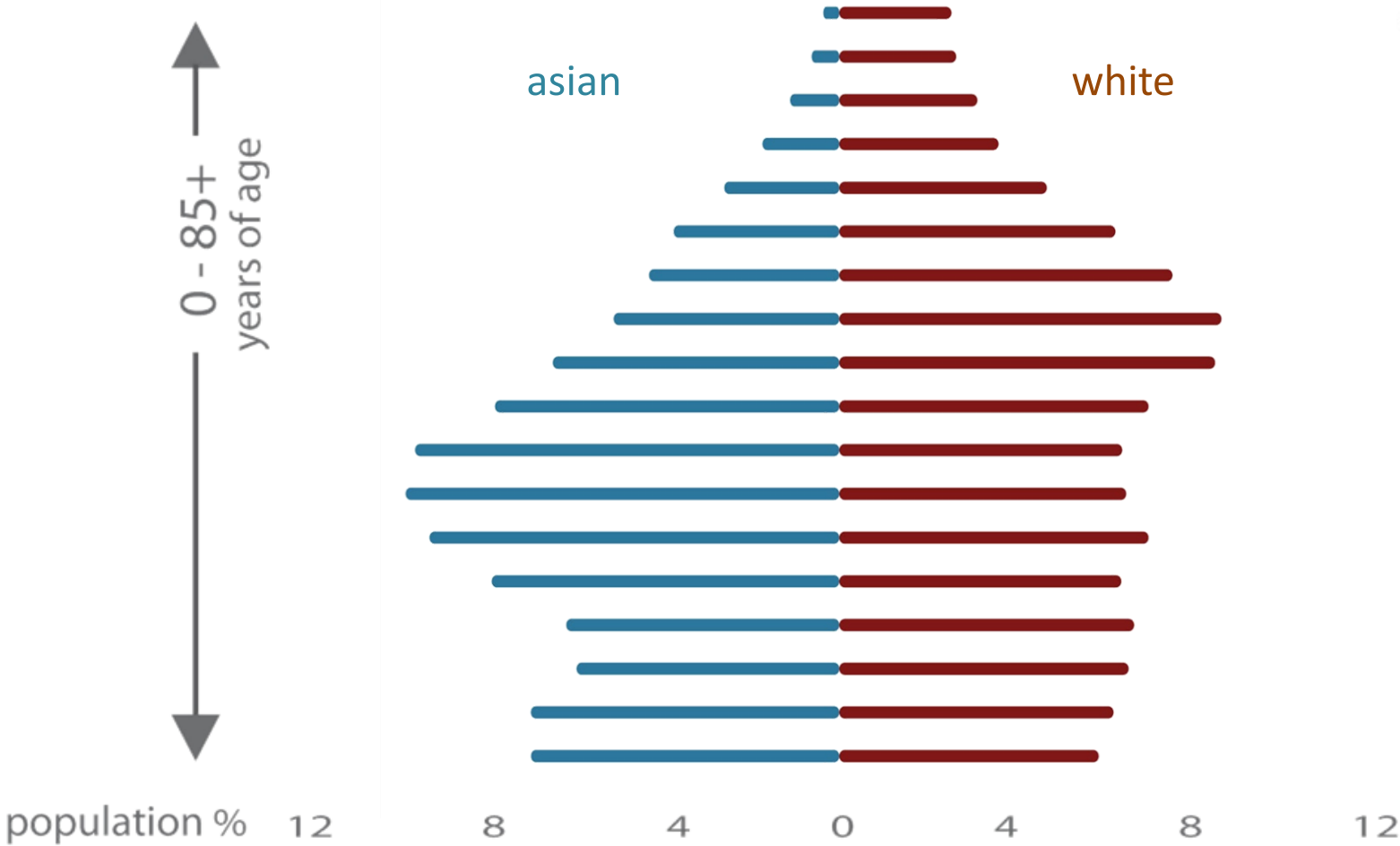


POPULATION PYRAMID: asian/white



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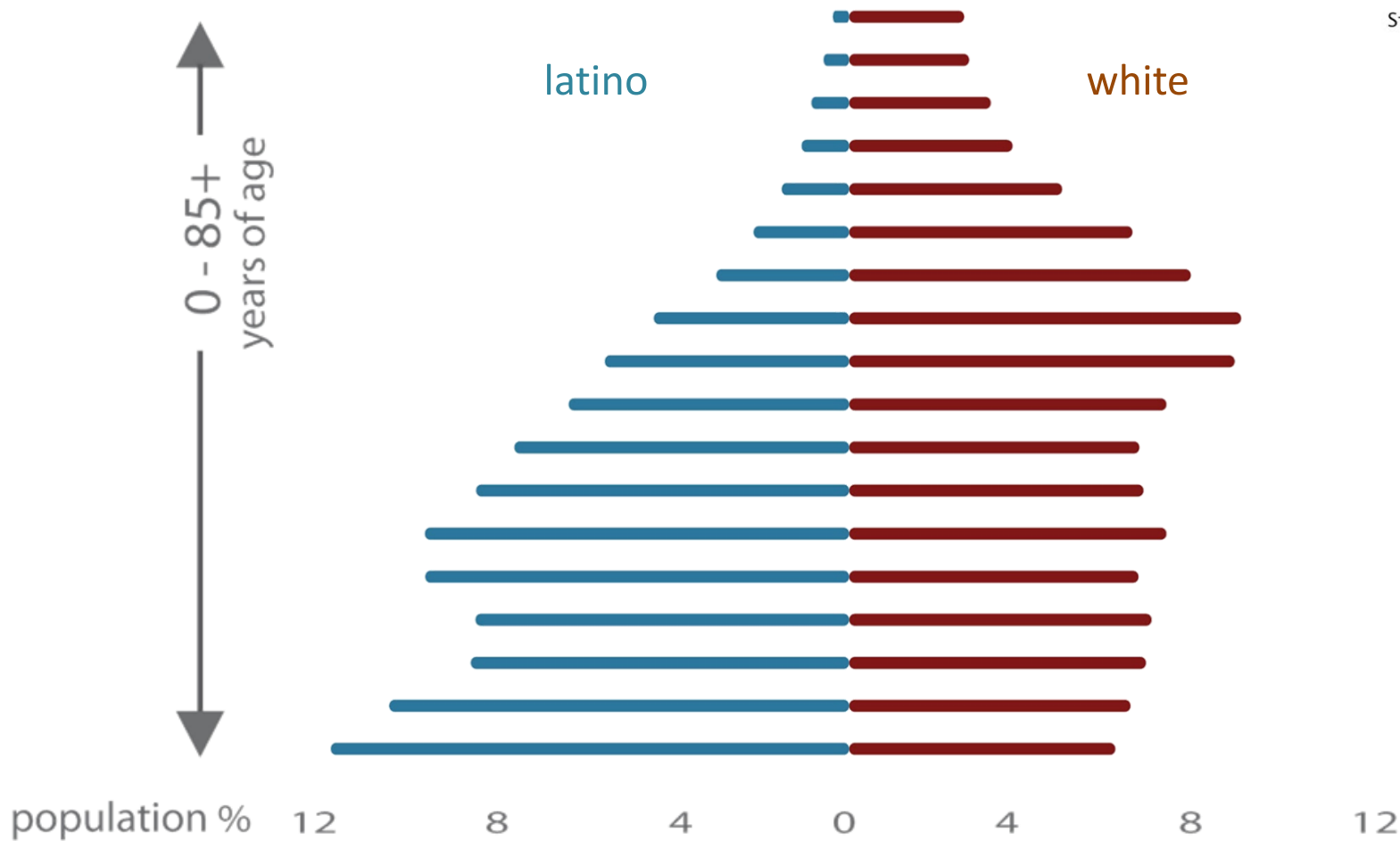


POPULATION PYRAMID: latino/white



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AGE STRUCTURE

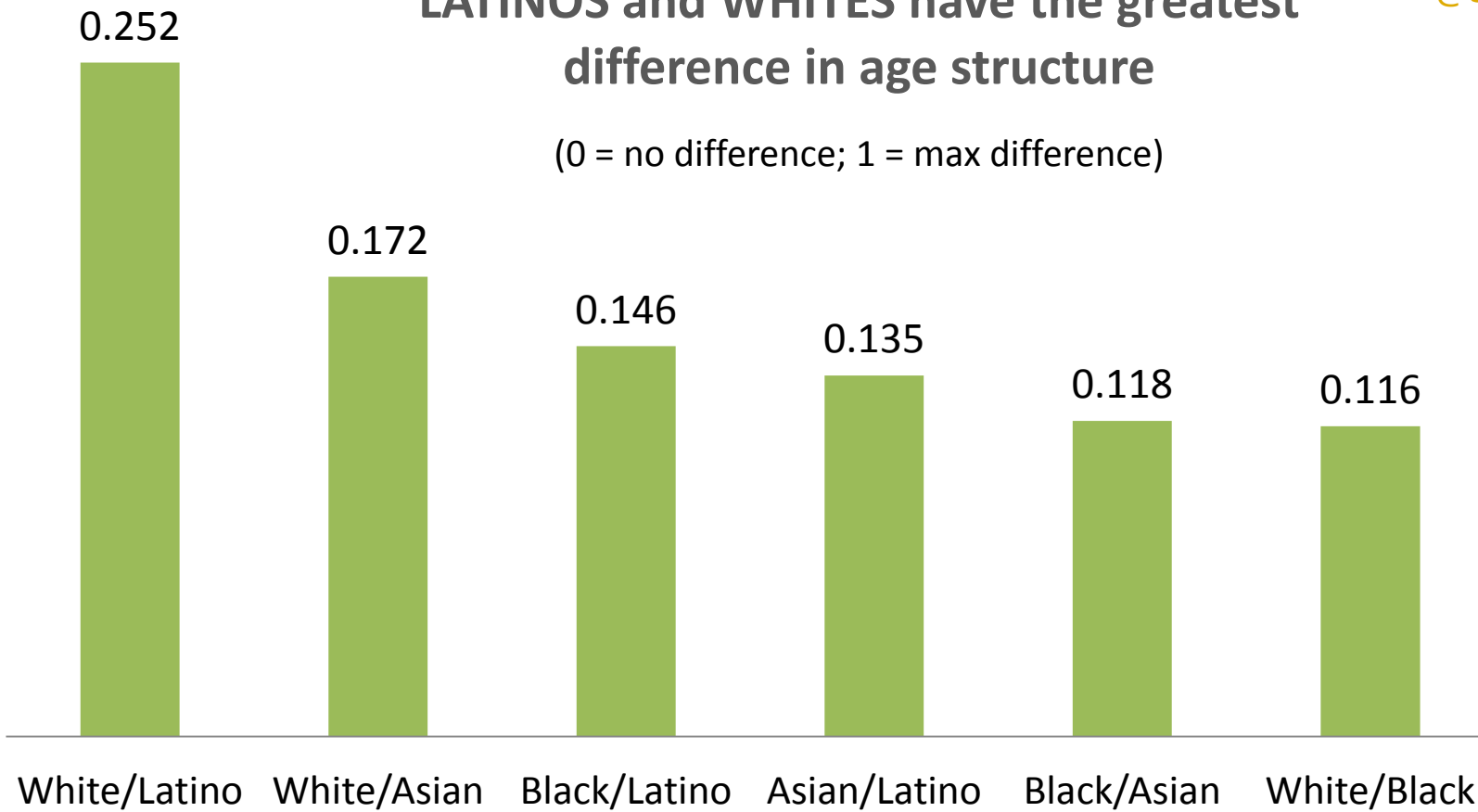


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LATINOS and WHITES have the greatest difference in age structure

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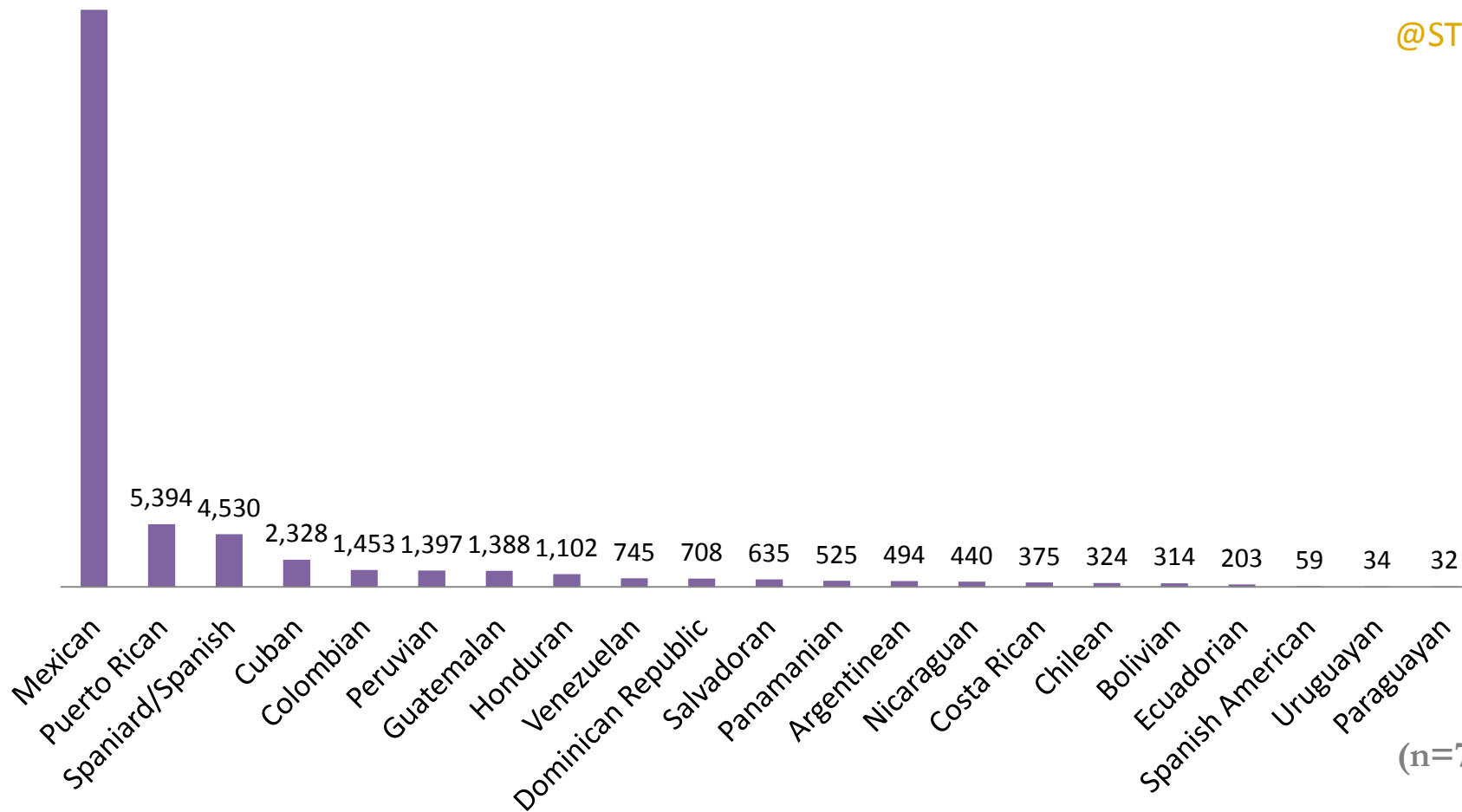
PAN-LATINO DIVERSITY in st. louis

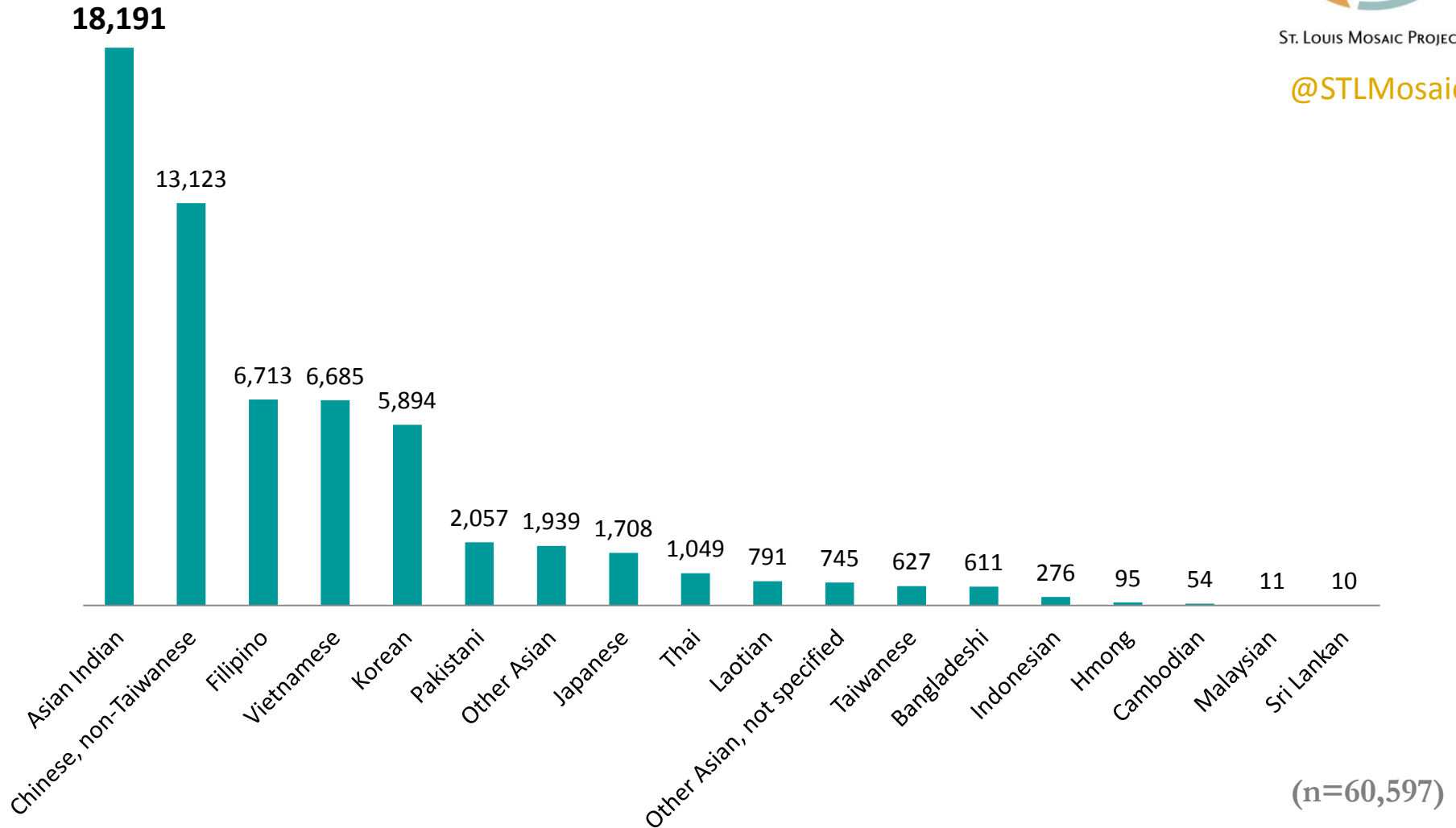

PAN-ASIAN DIVERSITY in st. louis



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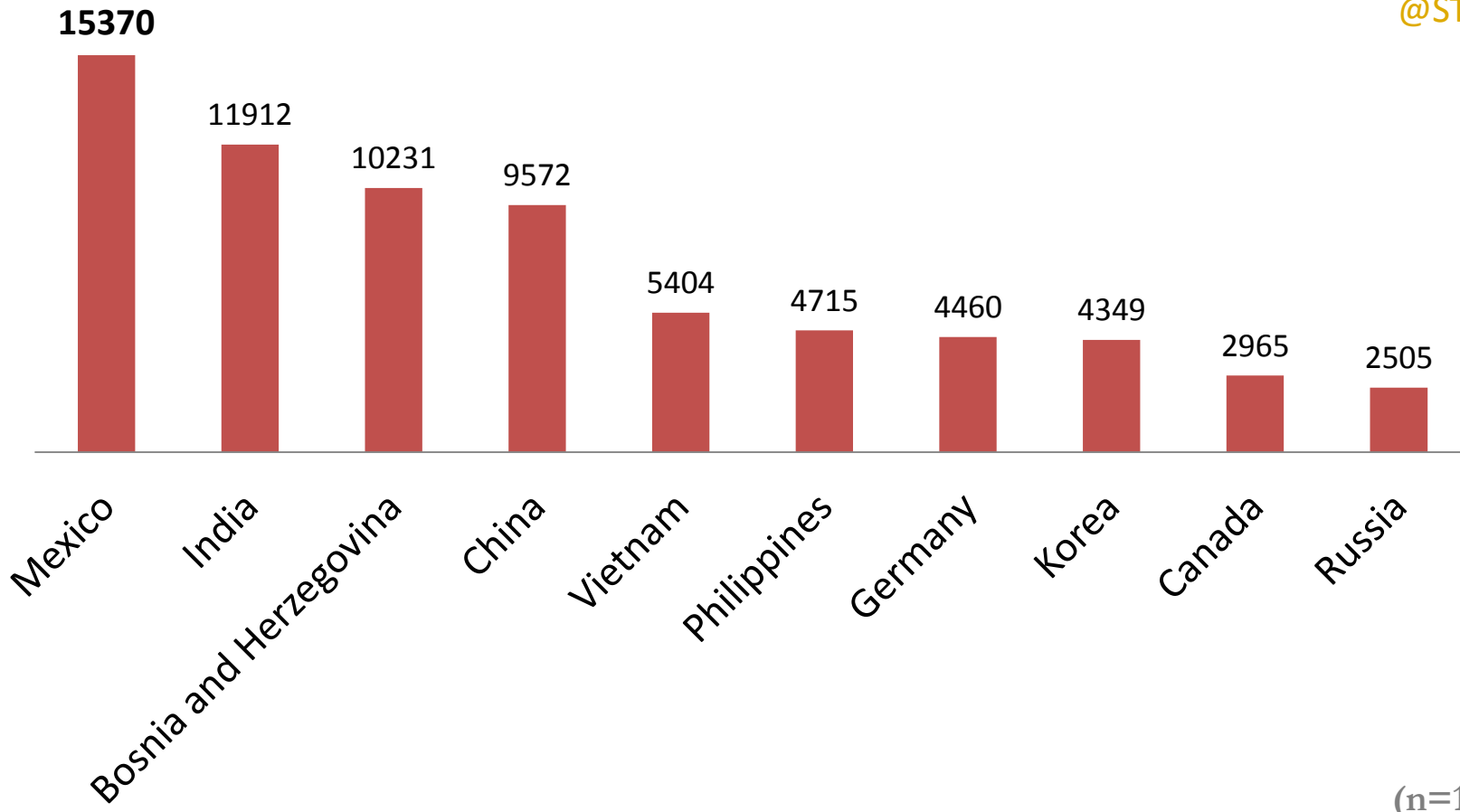


DIVERSITY OF FOREIGN-BORN in st. louis

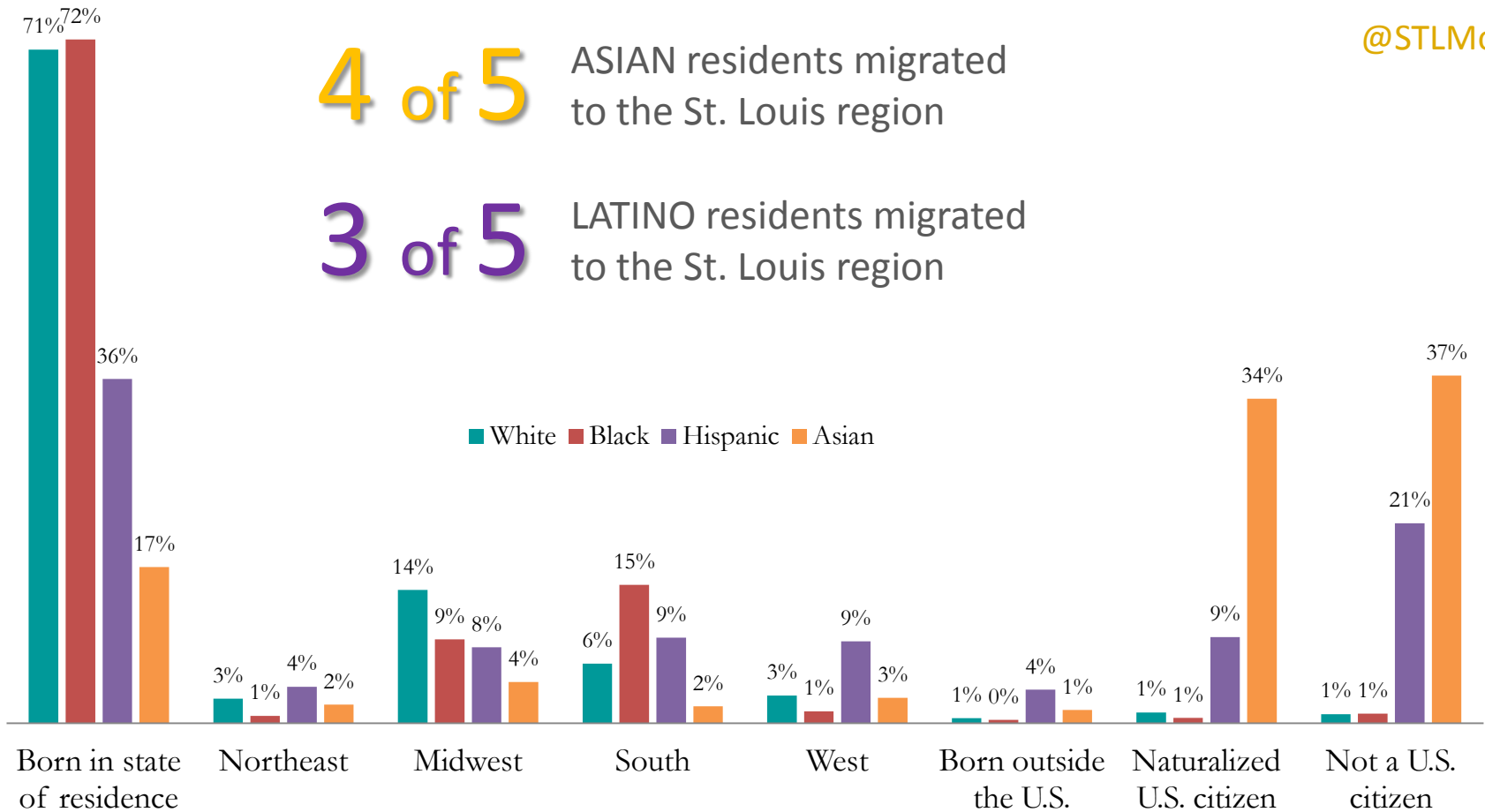


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4 of 5 ASIAN residents migrated to the St. Louis region

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POPULATION CURVES

- Significant ASIAN and LATINO population growth

AGE COHORT DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS

- LATINO residents are young and will continue to grow through birth and migration

PANETHNIC DIVERSITY

- Panethnic ASIAN and LATINO populations and diverse immigrant population

MIGRATION DEMOGRAPHIC TRANSITIONS

- The majority of ASIAN and LATINO residents are not from the region





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
