Organization Overview

Laumeier Sculpture Park, one of the first and largest sculpture parks in the country, is an internationally recognized, nonprofit arts organization that is accredited by the American Alliance of Museums and operates in partnership with St. Louis County Parks. Laumeier presents more than 70 works of large-scale outdoor sculpture in a 105-acre park that is free and open daily. Laumeier serves approximately 350,000 visitors of all ages each year with presentations of art through a sculpture collection, temporary exhibitions, education programs, public events, and more. The park is located in Sunset Hills, Missouri in St. Louis County.

Position Overview

Summer Art Camp is a signature Laumeier program that has been running continuously for over 30 years. It is beloved and highly respected in the community and maintains high standards of excellence. It is an outdoor camp, held on Laumeier's grounds. It runs for 8 weeks, from mid-June to early August.

The Art Camp Instructors are seasonal, hourly, non-exempt positions, reporting to the Learning & Engagement Specialist and working closely with the Education Coordinator and other art camp staff members. Art Camp Instructors play an integral role in ensuring that every learner experiences a fun and high-quality program that meets or exceeds the standards outlined in Laumeier's educational philosophy statement. Instructors are hired for and assigned to age groupings that include either: Ages 3.5-6; Rising grades K-5; or Rising grades 6-8. An outline of themes and the curriculum is provided, however, there is ample space for each instructor to put their own stamp on the program with supplementary lessons they design and implement. Art Camp Instructors receive paid training and also have the opportunity to participate in volunteer professional development opportunities throughout their time at Laumeier.

The schedule is as follows:

March 26 – May 21: Approximately 25 hours of paid training and professional development (PD) conducted in-person at Laumeier and at select locations around the St. Louis region. Some trainings may also be available via Zoom. Trainings and PD occur on Sundays.

June 4-5: Camp setup + special trainings, approximately 7:45am – 2:45pm

June 9: Camp Open House setup and event, approximately 1:30pm – 8:30pm

June 12 – August 4: Camp sessions, M-F, approximately 7:45am – 3:45pm for full-day programs; approximately 8:30am – 12:30pm or 11:30am – 3:30pm for half-day programs. *No programming on July 4.*
August 7: Cleanup day, approximately 8am – 4pm

Duties + Responsibilities

- Serve as a lead instructor for 8, one-week sessions
- Lead hikes, mindfulness exercises, and other outdoor activities
- Create an atmosphere that is fun, safe and promotes creative thinking
- Teach lessons from the curriculum provided by Laumeier and create supplementary age-appropriate content that draws from your areas of interest and expertise
- Prepare completed project examples
- Create supply lists
- Maintain proper inventory and storage of supplies
- Report all missing or damaged equipment to supervisor
- Attend all trainings and staff meetings
- Serve as an ambassador of Laumeier Sculpture Park
- Communicate with caregivers as needed
- Keep supervisor informed of all positive and negative feedback
- Complete all reports (attendance, accident, evaluation)
- Follow all COVID protocols which will be based on current CDC guidelines
- Perform additional duties as assigned by Learning & Engagement Specialist and Education Coordinator

Qualifications + Skills

The ideal candidate is someone passionate about art, education, and the desire to inspire kids; possesses a calm, patient demeanor; enjoys being outdoors and has the ability to work in a summer camp setting with a lot happening simultaneously.

- Flexibility and adaptability in a fast-paced work environment

Education + Experience

Previous experience teaching, activity planning, and working with a variety of art media is required. Higher education relating to Elementary Education, Art Education, Outdoor Education, Art Therapy, or Studio Art is preferred.

Additional Requirements

- Ability to pass a background check, including a check for criminal records
- Must be able to meet Laumeier's COVID vaccination requirements, which include providing proof of full vaccination
- Ability to work outdoors during the summer months is essential
- Ability to walk distances and lift and move program materials is required
