

from 2019-2021 for the U.S.




3% decline (-4,415) from 2019-2021 for the St. Louis metro



# Percent change of the foreign-born population from 2019 to 2021 for the peer metropolitan regions






# Foreign-born Population Change by State




## Foreign-Born Population Positive Change by State




## Foreign-Born Population Negative Change by State



## Percent Positive Change of the Foreign-born Population




## Percent Negative Change of the Foreign-born Population







# Summary



- Saint Louis experienced one of the largest declines (-3.3%) in percent change of the foreign-born population for the 2019-2021 time period.
  - 2019-2021 -6% - Phoenix
  - 2018-2019 -5% - Saint Louis
  - 2017-2018 -6% - Baltimore
  - 2016-2017 -3% - Riverside
- The decline in the foreign-born population brings Saint Louis below the 2011 foreign-born number.
- The decline in the foreign-born populaiton mostly came from non-citizens that were recent arrivals to the U.S.
